

Miroslav Havel, a Glass Master, Is Dead at 86

Miroslav Havel, a glass blower, cutter, engraver, designer, polisher and sculptor who was one of a pair of unlikely Czech immigrants to Ireland who together revived the Waterford glass industry after a century's dormancy,

"Over the years, Mr. Havel became a chandelier maker, cutting the glass for the chandeliers installed in Westminster Abbey in commemoration of its 900th anniversary in 1966, and, at the request of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, those in the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts."










Mr. Havel created the **Lismore** pattern seen here in a wine glass, based on designs of the original Waterford glass factory
